This conference is organized jointly by the research group on Families and Social Networks within the Network of Excellence "Economic Change, Quality of Life & Social Cohesion" and the research professorship on Demographic Development, Social Change, and Social Capital at the WZB. There will be invited papers. But also other papers are welcome.

The focus will be on inter-generational relationships within families and kinships networks as well as in society. The ambition, in fact, is to bring together strands of research and of thinking that usually develop separately. When looking at the aging of the population and at intergenerational relations, in fact, there is a general disjuncture in research and theory between the focus on "social generations" or age groups and family generations. Particularly, while aging is highly debated as a population and welfare sustainability issue, it is much less focused upon as a family issue and dimension (except in studies on care giving). This results also in simplistic theories about intergenerational conflict and about weakening family solidarities in increasing individualised societies. Another disjuncture may be found between studies on social mobility and, again, studies on intra-family transfers.
