About this Series:

The main goal of the comparative research project on "Consolidation of Democracy in Central and Eastern Europe" is to analyze the current state of consolidation of the newly implemented democracies in the countries of Central and Eastern Europe. A key criteria for evaluating democratic consolidation is the emergence of a political culture which is congruent to the created democratic structures. After a decade of personal experience with the new political and economic systems, the most interesting question refers to the effects of this specific experience on the formation of the political culture. The following topics will be analyzed in particular: - How do citizens evaluate the political and economic development in their own countries and do these evaluations affect their basic attitudes towards democracy and market economy? - How does socialization in a state-socialist system affect current attitudes towards democracy and market economy? - What are the differences in political culture between former state-socialist countries and countries in Western Europe? - How did the political culture in Central and Eastern Europe change since the early 1990s after a decade of experience with the actual functioning of the new political and economic systems? What future trends can be determined? The database of the project consists of representative population surveys (18

years and older) that have been conducted by national research teams in fourteen Central and Eastern European countries (including East Germany) between 1998 and 2001. Additionally, the survey has been carried out in West Germany. The research project is coordinated by Edeltraud Roller, Dieter Fuchs, Hans-Dieter Klingemann, Bernhard Wessels (Social Science Research Center Berlin, WZB), and János Simon (Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Budapest). Already in 1990-92 comparable data have been collected in eleven Central and Eastern European countries. These countries are Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Estonia, Hungary, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Slovenia, Ukraine, Central Russia (Krasnojarsk), and East Germany (where the survey was conducted in 1992). This offers an opportunity for cross-time comparison. The 1990-92 data have been collected by the comparative research project "Post-Communist Publics" coordinated by László Bruszt (Central European University, Budapest) and János Simon (Institute for Political Science of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Budapest). The data are distributed by the Zentralarchiv für Empirische Sozialforschung der Universität zu Köln under the ZA study number ZA3218 ("The Post-communist Citizen 1990-1992"). Results of the first wave of the Post-Communist Publics Study were published in the book "The Postcommunist Citizen" edited by Samuel H.
